The Beta Mu Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha is celebrating its 91st year on campus in 2011. It is a pleasure to report a highly successful summer recruitment resulting in 34 new fall pledges. Pike academic rankings also remain high within the Greek system. Pikes enjoy leadership positions in campus organizations like Texas Cowboys and Silver Spurs, our philanthropic commitment is expanding and we possess great support from alumni.

The fall 2011 pledge class boasts 34 young men from throughout Texas as well as new members from Alaska, California, Colorado, Connecticut, and New York. These new pledges follow a terrific spring 2011 pledge class of eight brothers who were initiated in April. We now have an active chapter membership of 125.

BETA MU BROTHER TURNS LOVE OF FISHING INTO LIFELONG CAREER

Key Puckett '61 Used Fishing to Bond with Brothers

A fter going through the recruitment process at the University of Texas, **Key Puckett '61** decided to join Pi Kappa Alpha because he enjoyed the brothers' company and personalities. As an undergraduate, Key had the opportunity to meet a lot of new people, many of whom he is still friends with today. Some of his favorite memories include playing in a band called Little Tad and the Whippersnappers and bonding with his brothers through fishing.

After graduating with his law degree in 1968, Key worked in the Touche Ross' tax department in Corpus Christi, Texas, and then as vice president treasurer

with Earth Resources Corp., a Dallas company engaged in oil, gas, and the exploration and development of mineral properties. Key excelled at his job but realized it wasn't for him. Instead, he wanted his love of fishing to become his life's work. He decided to buy stock in Fishin' World Inc. in 1972 and then purchased a majority of the stock in 1973. In 1976, Key resigned his job at Earth Resources and began work at Fishin' World Inc. full time. "Business was great," Key said. "We had a few bad years, like in the late 1980s and early 2000s, but my decision in 1976 was a good one." Key is the owner of the business.

Key's love of fishing and boating allowed him to experience many new things throughout his life. He fished the Texas bill-fish circuit and was headquartered in Port Aransas, Texas, where some of the world's finest fishing on the Texas coast is said to be found. He has won several major tournaments, including the Port Aransas Round-Up twice, and the prestigious Texas Legends Billfish Tournament in 2007. When Key wasn't busy fishing, he competed in drag boat racing. He has competed in more than 100 different races, from 1990 to 2004, winning the World Championship in 1997 and 2001. He set the Outboard Drag Boat Association national speed record for the profuel class at 120.7 mph in October 2001, which still stands today.
