In the 2012-13 school year we proudly initiated 33 new members from Texas, Tennessee, California, Arizona, and Maryland into our brotherhood. This spring, 14 of our seniors graduated and our active membership now stands at a very healthy 132. Moving into the summer, fall rush is a priority for the chapter. Community Service and Academics a Priority for Pike

Over the course of the spring, the chapter undertook philanthropic service projects, such as working with Texas Exes on The Project, a day of service improving a blighted East Austin neighborhood. Pikes also enjoy leadership positions in campus organizations like Texas Cowboys and Silver Spurs, and we possess solid support from alumni. Pike academic rankings continue to be in top third of the Greek system. Academics remain a constant at the Pike house. The fall Pike pledge class was second among the 23 IFC fraternities with nearly a 3.3 G.P.A., while the actives were ninth of 23, generating a combined overall G.P.A. of 3.188, ranking Pike seventh of 23 fraternities and placing in the top third of fraternities G.P.A. overall. Nine brothers earned 4.0s. Although we are pleased with our academic progress, we are constantly looking for ways to improve our academic standing.

Popular Pike Al McNamara '80 Succumbs After Multi-Year Cancer Battle

"Tank" Had Lasting Impression on U.T. Pikes

Ibert C. McNamara III '80, affectionately known to Pikes as Al or "Tank," passed away February 15, 2013, after a courageous battle with cancer that lasted nearly 20 years. Al had recurring bouts of leukemia over many years and later inoperable throat cancer that claimed his life. He was a loving husband, devoted father, conscientious worker, loyal friend, and an inspiration to all.

Al was born in Houston on August 16, 1961, to Sandra and A. C. "Mac" McNamara Jr. He graduated from San Marcos High School in 1979 and attended the University of Texas at Austin, graduating in 1983 with a B.A. in petroleum land management. In addition to his membership in Pike, Al was a member of Texas Cowboys and was a founder and active participant of a secretive Pike golfing organization, T.O.A.D. or Tournament of Aging Derelicts.

After graduation, Al worked as a landman in the oil and gas industry, in site acquisition and leasing in the telecom industry, and as a residential real estate appraiser.

The love of Al's life was his bride, Jean Anderson, whom he met at a Texas Exes

function in Houston in 1987. They were married in 1988 and settled in Bellaire, with their two children, Paige Elizabeth and Jack.

In addition to Jean and his children, Al is survived by his parents, Mac and Sandy; sister Audrey Curl and husband Paul; niece and nephew Anna and Matthew Curl, all of San Antonio; brother Andrew McNamara and his wife Amy of Minneapolis; father and motherin-law John and Sue Anderson of Houston; sister-in-law Suzanne Anderson of Austin; and countless friends.

Amongst many friends at Al's February 22 memorial service in Houston were many Texas Pikes. **Tucker Graves '78** eulogized Al with his trademark humor, reminding friends of Al's incredible sense of humor and fun times spent with him. Tucker recalled Al dressing up in a wig and dress, successfully sitting for a photo in the Pi Phi's section of the Cactus yearbook, and when new apartments were under construction adjacent to the IIKA House, Al placed a sign on the property reading "Future Home of the Pi Kappa Alpha House." Al's loved ones were reminded of the resolve he had to battle cancer and his commitment to enjoy life and be an active parent and husband

in the face of serious illness.

More than 50 Pike brothers initiated in the late 1970s and early 1980s attended the funeral service. Al's pledge brother and fellow Texas Cowboy **Paul Swope '80** shared memories of Al with *The Beta Mu Review* tracking the themes of the Tucker Graves' eulogy. "Al was the kind of person you always wanted to be around because he had the uncanny ability to put a smile on your face with his quick wit and good humor. Al, with Jean always by his side, was an inspiration on how a husband and father handles adversity with honor and class. He was a fighter who fought longer than most could withstand. Cheers to Al."

Al enjoyed numerous outdoor pursuits, including cycling, camping, canoeing, and river floating. He closely followed Texas Longhorns football and only severe bouts of his illness kept him from U.T. home games. Al was a member of the Boy Scouts of America Bellaire Methodist Troop 222, along with his son. He was an active member of St. Luke's United Methodist Church.
