une signifies an important milestone in the *Honoring Our Legacy, Securing Our Future* campaign—plans for the new chapter house will be filed with the City of Austin. As the plans are reviewed, the campaign board is focusing on financing. There is a significant need for continued alumni support as we progress toward demolition in 2019.

To date, we have raised \$4,164,495toward our \$5 million fundraising goal. In order to properly fund the project, we must reach this benchmark so the chapter does not have to take on additional long-term debt.

At 98, Beta Mu's Oldest Living Alumnus, Jack Meadows '37 Supports Campaign for Beta Mu

uring pledge week of 1936, Jack Meadows '37 visited the Beta Mu house and was immediately impressed with the "nice bunch of fellows" who greeted him. Though finances kept him from initiation until the following year, Jack can still recall many memories from his years as an active brother.



His recollections of roommates are some of his favorite memories and he can re-

member living with late 1930s fellow members **Pete Durham '41** and **Cliff Carter '40** his senior year. He even went on double dates with Cliff and the ladies that would become their wives. Additionally, Jack helped Pike win the intramural basketball championship, was on a tennis scholarship (which was one brand new racquet and a weekly tennis ball), and played a fair share of nightly ping pong matches.

To support the future success of the Pike house and foster a place where young men can form relationships, Jack supported the Beta Mu capital campaign. His years in Pike offered him a time to associate with many good people and helped him become a more involved member of society and he sees the campaign as a way for alumni to support the chapter as best they can.

After graduation from UT, Jack served in the U.S. Navy. He was commissioned in 1941 as an engineering officer and was released from service in 1945, but stayed active in the reserve until 1961, where after 20 years, he retired as commander. In 1945, Jack went to work for the Crossett Company in Arkansas as a power plant engineer. Later, Jack became a vice president at Georgia Pacific, and in 1975, he moved to the Portland, Oregon-based Times Mirror Corporation where he was senior vice president until 1985. Today, Jack lives in Fayetteville, Arkansas. During his time with these companies, he also stayed active in the community, serving on the Jaycees for many years, and serv-

ing two terms on the Arkansas State Board of Education. "Do the best you can in your education," he advises current students. "Get as much education as you can and do the best with what you learn. Do as much in the civic arena as possible."

Jack, now aged, was married to Jane Duls for 70 years and dated for seven years before they wed. Jane passed away in 2014, leaving Jack with their four children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Two of Jack's sons, Jack Jr. and William (deceased), were Pikes at the University of Arkansas.

Beta Mu Chapter Receives Top Ranking in National Pike Review

The International Pike Fraternity evaluates all 280 chapter and colonies with a professional staff visit annually. In Beta Mu's most recent evaluation, in fall 2017, the Chapter earned a report card score of 84.3 out of a possible 100. Pike earned perfect 100s in the health and safety/risk management, financial



management and alumni relations areas. Our men scored very highly in the 90s in scholarship, service, leadership, ritual and public relations.

Chapter President Garrett Beirne '16 said, "Our men strive to maintain Beta Mu's legacy of leadership. We have received the Raymond Orians Chapter Excellence Award (given to 20 top performing chapters) at five successive national conventions and we expect do so again at Pike's 150th Annual Convention in Richmond in July. There is always room for improvement in any organization and we continue to strive for excellence as a high performing chapter."

The national scorecard penalizes Beta Mu as UT Greeks do not participate in intramurals as they once did (hosting intra-Greek only games), and even though our recruitment/rush process works well, our ideal pledge class size of 35-40 falls lower than some other larger chapters penalizing us. Beta Mu's lowest score was in housing, with our dated facility rated a 65.

Of the 12 active Pike chapters in Texas, Beta Mu was surpassed only by UT-Arlington which carded a 95. The other ten Texas Pike chapters scored in the 70s or lower.

CHAPTER ETERNAL

Richard H. Moore Jr. '42 entered Chapter Eternal on March 9 at the age of 95. Dick joined the Army Air Corps in 1943 and served as chief gunner on a B29 plane. He was awarded the Air Medal five times and was awarded the Flying Cross. After his service, he attended the North Texas Agricultural College and UT, where he completed his law degree. Dick then practiced law for 60 years. He lived in Fort Worth.

Charles R. Morgan Jr. '53 entered Chapter Eternal on November 17, 2017, at the age of 85. Chuck and his wife of 55 years, Jeanie, had one daughter, Jill. His early years were spent in Texas, followed by Fairbanks, Alaska, for 42 years. While working at Design Alaska, he worked on the Akiuk Memorial School and the North Pole High School. Chuck loved fishing and sports and had a badminton tournament named in his honor in 2003.

James E. Alvis '61 entered Chapter Eternal on March 25, three days shy of his 76th birthday, after losing a 16-year battle with multiple myeloma. Jim graduated from UT with degrees in history and anthropology. In 1970, Jim was awarded a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities to document/photograph the transformation of Texas from a rural culture to urban state. Shortly before his death, Jim created a collection of these black and white photos into a book, *Texas Past a Fading Rural Heritage*. Jim shared his life with Sharon, his partner of 24 years. He is survived by Sharon and their three children.

Russel L. Farabee '74 entered Chapter Eternal on December 30, 2017, at the age of 62. Rusty first attended the University of North Carolina to play football for the Tarheels and later transferred to UT and completed law school at SMU. He practiced real estate law in the Dallas area for more than 30 years, had a deep love for animals, and loved discussing politics, reading science fiction and singing. He is survived by his daughters, Valerie and Elizabeth.


