

Pike academic rankings continue to be the upper tier of the Greek System, Pikes enjoy leadership positions in campus organizations like Silver Spurs and the Interfraternity Council, our philanthropic commitment is continuously expanding, and we possess one of the strongest alumni bases at the university. Thanks for considering being a part of the UT Fraternity system and allowing us to introduce Pi Kappa Alpha. As with most fraternities at Texas, we recruit new members or "rush" in the summer for our traditional Fall new member class. This year we expect to have 45–50 new members pledge Pike, usually composed of freshmen and sophomore students. 
## Scholars, Leaders, Athletes and Gentlemen

Pike was a founding member of FACT in 2017. The organization brings together all volunteer chapter advisers as a unified voice on health and safety and other community matters.







- Pike was founded at The University of Virginia in 1868.
- International Fraternity has more than 200 chapters and colonies with more than 320,000 members initiated and 14,000 undergraduate members, making it the 5th largest fraternity nationally.
- Beta Mu Chapter, University of Texas was founded in 1920.
- Beta Mu Chapter has initiated almost 3,000 members since its founding.
- Beta Mu Chapter has 110 active members, following May 2022 graduation of 22 seniors.
